Mr. Robert C. Byrd introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Interior and Ansular Affairs

A BILL

To amend the National Trails System Act by designating the Potomac Heritage Trail located in portions of Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia as a component of the National Trails System.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That this Act may be cited as the "Potomac Heritage Na-
- 4 tional Scenic Trail Act of 1975".
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 5 (a) of the National Trails System Act
- 6 (16 U.S.C. 1244) is amended (1) by inserting immediately
- 7 before the period at the end of the first sentence a semi-
- 8 colon and the following: "except that the Secretary of the
- 9 Interior may designate non-Federal segments of the Potomac

- 1 Heritage National Scenic Trail"; (2) by deleting in the
- 2 second sentence thereof the words "the initial"; (3) by
- 3 deleting in paragraph (3) thereof the words "an advisory
- 4 council for the Appalachian National Scenic Trail" and in-
- 5 serting in lieu thereof "advisory councils for the Appalachian
- 6 and Potomac Heritage National Scenic Trails"; (4) by re-
- 7 designating paragraph (3) thereof as paragraph (4); and
- 8 (5) by inserting immediately after paragraph (2) thereof
- 9 the following new paragraph:
- 10 "(3) The Potomac Heritage Trail, a corridor of ap-
- 11 proximately eight hundred and seventy-four miles extending
- 12 from the mouth of the Potomac River to its source (except
- 13 for one segment extending into Pennsylvania) following the
- 14 route as generally depicted on the map, identified as Na-
- 15 tional Trails System, Proposed Potomac Heritage Trail Cor-
- 16 ridor, which shall be on file and available for public inspec-
- 17 tion in the office of the Director of the National Park Service:
- 18 Provided, (i) That only those segments of the corridor lo-
- 19 cated within exterior boundaries of federally administered
- 20 areas are designated as the Potomac Heritage National
- 21 Scenic Trail by this Act; and (ii) That the Secretary of the
- 22 Interior may designate lands outside of federally adminis-
- 23 tered areas as segments of the Potomac Heritage National
- 24 Scenic Trail upon application from the States (including the
- 25 District of Columbia) or local governmental agencies in-

- 1 volved if such segments meet the criteria established in this
- 2 Act and are administered by such agencies without expense
- 3 to the United States. The segments of the Potomac Heritage
- 4 National Scenic Trail designated by this Act shall be ad-
- 5 ministered by the Secretary of the Interior, in consultation
- 6 with the heads of other Federal agencies where lands admin-
- 7 istered by them are involved. The Secretary of the Interior,
- 8 within three years after the effective date of this paragraph,
- 9 shall prepare guidelines for development, management, and
- 10 maintenance of the Potomac Heritage Trail, except that it
- 11 is the sense of the Congress that the Secretary, with respect
- 12 to his authority to provide certain facilities within the Poto-
- 13 mac Heritage National Scenic Trail, should immediately
- 14 utilize that authority to construct campsites, shelters, and
- 15 related public use facilities within those parts of such trail
- 16 which are located within areas of high unemployment.".
- 17 Sec. 3. Section 7 (e) of the National Trails System Act
- 18 (16 U.S.C. 1246) is amended by inserting immediately
- 19 before the period at the end of the first sentence thereof a
- 20 comma and the following: "except that the foregoing pro-
- 21 visions of this proviso shall not apply to the Potomac Her-
- 22 itage National Scenic Trail".
- 23 Sec. 4. There are authorized to be appropriated such
- 24 sums as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this
- 25 Act.
